

## **HOW TO VOTE BY MAIL OR IN PERSON**

## **VOTING BY MAIL**

#### **IMPORTANT**

- VOTE EARLY, before October 20, to be sure that your vote gets counted. The sooner you can return your ballot the better!
- The LWV highly recommends that you bypass the regular mail system and use a SECURE BALLOT DROP
  BOX (or other option) to return your ballot. The boxes are emptied daily by election officials and get to the
  Board of Elections faster than by mail. You must use a drop box located in your county. Ballots will not
  be taken/delivered to other counties' Board of Elections.
- You must **FOLLOW THE DIRECTIONS** on the ballot **EXACTLY** and fill it out **COMPLETELY** or <u>your vote will</u> **NOT be counted!** Avoid **stray marks**, **tears**, and **other accidental flubs** that could **disqualify your ballot**.
- If you damage or fill out your form incorrectly, <u>request a supplemental ballot immediately</u> from your county's Board of Elections: <u>https://www.state.nj.us/state/elections/county-eo.shtml</u>

#### 1. HOW TO CAST YOUR VOTE BY MAIL IN BALLOT

1. Mark your ballot <u>completely</u>. With your pen, select your candidate by completely filling in the oval next to your candidate's name. Mark "yes" or "no" to the Public Questions.

#### **IMPORTANT** DO NOT TEAR OFF THE FLAP ON THE INNER ENVELOPE!

This is how your anonymity is maintained.

- 2. Complete and SIGN the Certificate of Mail-in Voter using your "official" signature. Sign carefully and legibly. Your signature is matched to the signature you used when your registered to vote. If your signature has changed or you have changed your name, be sure to update it by re-registering.
- 3. Put your completed ballot in the Inner envelope and SEAL. It must be sealed for your ballot to count. AGAIN, DO NOT TEAR OFF THE FLAP!
- 4. Put your Inner envelope in First-Class, postage paid, return Outer envelope and SEAL. NO STAMP NEEDED.
- 5. Double check every part of your ballot in case you left something out or made a mistake!
- 6. (Whichever is applicable for your county) Write in your return address or make sure your preprinted address is showing.
- 7. If you have asked someone to return your ballot for you (your "bearer"), the "Bearer" must complete the "Bearer" portion of the envelope.
- 8. Return your ballot before the deadline.

### 2. HOW TO RETURN YOUR COMPLETED VOTE BY MAIL BALLOT

#### **DEADLINE TO RETURN OPTIONS** YOUR COMPLETED VOTE BY **MAIL BALLOT ATTENTION:** A notice will be sent with the location of your county's **SECURE BALLOT** DROP BOXES and your designated POLLING PLACE before or by Oct. 23. # VOTING IN PERSON ON ELECTION DAY November 3, 2020

#### **IMPORTANT**

Polling places will be limited. You may not be able to vote in the same place you always have.

A notice will be sent with your designated POLLING PLACE before or by October 23.

#### **NEW**

You can bring in and drop off your vote by mail ballot at your designated polling place.

Hand it directly to a poll worker.

- Polling places are open from 6 a.m. 8 p.m.
- Voters who choose to cast their ballot in person rather than completing a mail-in ballot, will do so on a provisional ballot NOT via a machine. (NOTE: Provisional ballots are paper ballots that are counted after a voter's eligibility is confirmed. In the case of voters who received a mail-in ballot, their provisional ballots will be counted once it is verified that they did not cast a vote using the mail-in ballot.)
- Individuals with disabilities will have access to an ADA-conforming voting machine.
- Sample ballots will <u>not</u> be mailed out for this election. Active voters will receive a postcard with instructions on how to view a sample ballot online, and a sample ballot will be displayed at the polling places on election day.
- If this is your first time voting in NJ or if you did not show ID when you registered, you will need to show it. Acceptable ID includes:
  - Any photo ID, with or without an address: NJ driver's license, passport, student or employment ID, military or government ID, store memberships cards, etc.
  - Any document that has your name and current address: bank statement, car registration, government check or document, nonphoto driver's license, utility bill, paycheck, rent receipt, etc.
