

2020 ELECTION VOTING CHANGES – Quick Reference Guide

- **Online Voter Registration** is here! You can now register to vote quickly and easily at this link <https://voter.svrs.nj.gov/register>
 - If your mailing address has changed, you will need to re-register.
 - **Registration deadline for this election is October 13.**
- All active voters and newly registered voters will automatically be sent a Vote by Mail ballot.
 - If you do not receive your Vote by Mail ballot by October 12, immediately contact your County Clerk. (If you registered close to the deadline, it may take a bit longer to receive your ballot).
 - If you have lost or damaged your Vote by Mail ballot, you may request a replacement ballot at your County Clerk's office.
- Voters who receive Vote by Mail ballots may **EITHER** vote using that ballot **OR** vote at their polling place using a provisional ballot.
 - Your polling place may have changed from previous elections.
 - A provisional ballot is counted once it is confirmed that a mail-in ballot has not been cast.
- Vote by Mail Ballots may Be Returned in Several Ways
 - Secure Ballot Drop Boxes – at locations throughout your county
 - You must use **only** drop boxes in your own county.
 - Mail – in the provided first-class postage paid envelope
 - Polling Places – ballots may be dropped off on Election Day, Nov. 3
 - You will be notified of Secure Drop Box locations and your polling place.

IMPORTANT! League of Women Voters highly recommends:

- **Returning ballots before October 20** to be sure they are counted. The sooner the better!
- Bypassing the regular mail system and **using a Secure Ballot Drop Box** to return your ballot.
